George Mize's 1935 Convertible Coupe, Bremerton, WA

June 12th 1936, according to the build card, is the day George Mize's 1936 P2 rumble seat convertible came off the assembly line in Detroit. The car was sold at the Blackstone Motor Company in Elmira N.Y. Only 3297 of this model were built. George purchased his Plymouth driver" in 1994 and puts over 2000 miles on it every July touring the Northwest. He also drives to numerous day tours, shows and cruise-ins around the Seattle-Bremerton area where he is a member of the Olympic Vintage Auto Club.

The convertible is original except for the rims and radial tires. In 1970 the car had been painted royal blue and a new top was installed. The engine and transmission were rebuilt at the same time.

The P2 has never been fully restored, but George has done a lot of cosmetic work on it. When asked, "why not do a complete restoration", he responds, "it looks good and drives great, to restore it I'd have to quit driving it for some time". No way! Most people say they have never seen a 36 convertible before. George tells them to look close, because they may never see another one of these rare cars. He would like to know if there are any other 36 convertibles in the Northwest.




