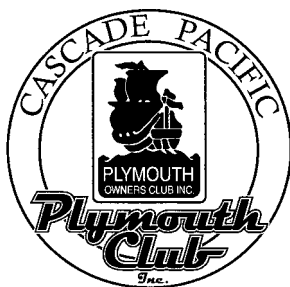

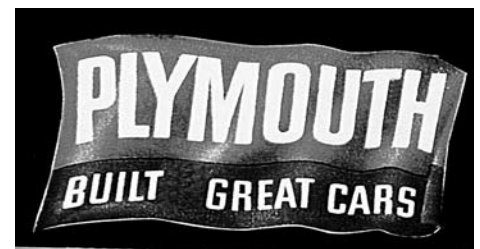
The DJ, Rob, will be from the Columbia Gorge Interpretive Center. He will bring the CGIC sound system.

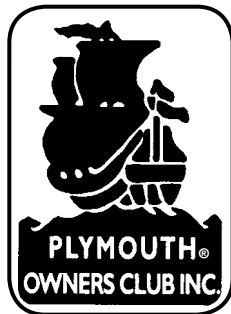
