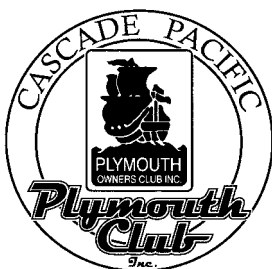

Randy Ealy spells out importance of Internet sales to CPPC's health

Hello CPPC club members near and far. I would like to introduce you to Mike Bade, long time member and current chairman of the board of directors. He and his wife Donna are very active in our club and one of the reasons Pam and I are members.

About 3 years ago our club, like others, lost our fund raisers due to the pandemic. Our car show was cancelled, and the Swap meet was also cancelled. Later years have been lean due to weather and lack of help at the swap meet.

Our club expenses are in the range of \$6000.00 a year which pay for our meeting hall, insurance, web site, Pay-

Pal fees, printing, and newsletter costs. When the board sat down and looked at our lack of income from car show and swap meet, they realized the club would only exist 2 more years with our current rate of income.

About that time Mike Bade became our superhero when he started e-bay sales of items in our trailer that did not sell at the swap meet. He put that money in our treasury, and this is saving our bacon. The Board has praised Mike for his time and effort and passed, by unanimous vote to let Mike, or any club member, keep 50% of the net profit of their sales for the time they spend on e-bay, packaging, shipping, etc.

This was done in hopes that other club members would get involved and help Mike sell these parts. To date Mike has donated \$16000 to our club treasury. He has procured more donated parts and clearly sees more future sales. The Board needs to ask our 115 members if there are others that would like to help in selling these treasures and make some extra cash. If you call Mike, and he can set you up with parts and online sales.

As a long time member, I want to say Thank You Mike.

Most of the cars from Bill's collection have been sold, but when it came time to address the literal truckload of spare parts – including a couple of freshly-overhauled engine-transmission combos ready for service – Bill's son Todd decided simply to give them to the club his dad founded in 2000.

That's Todd at left, with his mother, Dolores, who still serves as treasurer of

Cascade Pacific Plymouth Club.

The collection included a fresh engine/transmission for a 1933 Plymouth, and a similar ready-to-go set for a relatively rare Ford 60hp V8, plus lots of NOS trim from the 1930s-1940s.

It was about half a day's work to load everything into Jim Wheat's and Mike Bade's vehicles, and the value of the goods was substantial enough that at the June 13 meeting the CPPC board voted to dedicate the proceeds from the sales of these items to a scholarship at Clackamas Community College in the name of Bill and Dolores Call.

The Board of Directors of Cascade Pacific Plymouth Club met on Tuesday, June 13, 2023, at Elmer's Restaurant in Clackamas, Oregon.

The meeting was called to order at 11:43AM.

Minutes of the May 8, 2023 board meeting were approved as published in the newsletter.

Treasurer Dolores Call's financial report was approved after discussion. The club remains in good financial condition; any board member can provide specifics.

There was brief discussion about emails from our domain being tagged as spam. Robin will investigate with Acorn Host, our internet service provider, to see what can be done about it.

Mike Bade reported on internet sales. Recent acquisitions from the estate of a previous club member have added approximately \$800 to the club treasury, and recent donations by Steve Parker and Bill and Dolores Call will easily eclipse that amount. Mike now has \$8700 worth of merchandise listed on eBay, if he gets his asking prices, which is approximately equivalent to

CPPC's annual budget.

Refreshments at the June 27, 2023 general meeting will be provided by Jerry and Ann Klinger. Jim Wheat will prepare a photo presentation.

Cruise-In Update: There were some last-minute details to address, including what to do/how to transport a donated 11-foot paddleboard.

The board agreed to do whatever was possible to promote an event CPPC member Bill Suchla is involved in, supporting the Amaranth Diabetes Association, held in Gaston, OR on Sunday, August 6. It will be announced in the next two club newsletters, promoted on our website, and boosted with email blasts.

An agenda item from Phil Lapin got some discussion: he was noting how much time and energy was spent providing technical support to non-club members. Board members concurred, but could see no potential for board action on the issue.

A donation of parts from Bill and Dolores Call includes two fresh engine/transmission sets, and a truckload or more of restoration parts left over from Bill's collection. The board committed to tracking receipts from this donation and making a gift in Bill and Dolores' names to the club scholarship fund at Clackamas Community College.
