



Tickets Still Available for Train Trip to Tacoma Glass and History Museums

ALL ABOARD! The train leaves the station on Saturday, May 2nd for a Club tour of the Tacoma Museum District.

Vicki Williams and Mindy Benfield are setting up this unique tour which begins at 8:45 a.m. when Amtrak train #500 leaves Vancouver, Washington with at least 36 CPPC members aboard. The Club will have its own train car and all 36 seats have already been filled.

That doesn't mean you still can't go, though. Members who haven't signed up and would like to attend the tour in Tacoma can make arrangements to take the same train, they will just be in another car. Just call Amtrak and make a reservation for train #500 going to Tacoma and train #509 returning from Tacoma at 6:15 p.m. with arrival back in Vancouver at 8:29pm.

Reservations can also be made on line. Seniors (62+) receive a 15% discount. Some members are riding the train from Salem and some from Oregon City but all will meet in Vancouver to board as a group. Members are responsible for getting to Vancouver on their own. There is free parking at the Vancouver station which is located at 1301 West 11th St. Amtrak suggests arriving about an hour before departure. The train arrives in Tacoma at 10:56 a.m. It is about a two block walk to catch the Link Train (Tacoma's version of MAX)

that will take us right to the door of the Tacoma Museum of Glass.

The exterior of this museum is every bit as spectacular as the interior with the Dale Chihuly Bridge of Glass which leads to the Washington History Museum.

Before a 1:00 p.m. guided tour of the glass museum the group will have lunch at Harmon's Brewery. You can check their menu on their website at www. harmon.harmonbrewingco.com.

After the glass museum tour people can do self-guided tours of either the History Museum or the Art Museum or wander over to the University of Washington-Tacoma which is a unique cluster of buildings utilizing old storefronts. The University's library boasts a 20-foot long red Dale Chihuly chandelier.

REAR WHEEL BEARING LUBRICATION

Use a short fiber wheel bearing grease (Medium).

Remove the plugs in the rear side of the axle housing near the brake support plates, then lubricate with 1/2 ounce of recommended lubricant, using a low pressure gun.

Replace the plug.

DO NOT OVER-LUBRICATE

If a relief plug is used on the grease gun, the exact amount of lubricant can be applied. Over lubrication may result in grease leaking past the seals onto the brake linings.

DO NOT lubricate any rubber parts, such as the sway bar bushings, shock absorber mountings and rear spring shackle bushings. They are designed to operate without lubrication. Lubricating them will cause them to slip and result in rapid wear.


