2010 Summer POC Meet was financial success

The 2010 Plymouth Owners Club-National Summer Meet came out in the black by about \$5,500.

In round figures, \$23,800 went into the 2010 Meet account, and \$17,300 was paid out.

Deducting the \$2,000 seed money from the CPPC treasury, that's still \$3,500 and some change.

We had \$3,000 dollars from CPPC members to get the fundraising started.

Business donations totaled about \$1,750 in cash, although the value of dinated goods was far greater.

Registrations for the 174 paid meet atendees brought in \$2,605.00. Car registrations for the 41 judged, 51 nonjudged and 27 open class cars brought in \$1,790.00.

Special newsletter planned for CPPC's tenth birthday

The issue of the CPPC newsletter that went missing during the 2010 POC Summer Meet will be will be replaced with a special 10th Anniversary Issue in October, when the Club officially celebrates its tenth birthday.

Consensus at July's Board Meeting was that CPPC has heard just about enough about the 2010 Meet, and that a broader focus on our own club was in order.

Members who have suggestions about what should go into a 10th Anniversary Issue, or better yet, those who have items to contribute, should contact Robin Will or Mike Bade. The raffle brought in \$1,289 and the 50/50 came to \$143.00.

Mike Bade ordered 210 shirts for the meet, and all but two shirts have been sold. At the budgeted margin of \$4 per shirt, it appears that that we made about \$750.00 from shirt sales.

We received \$1,200 from the POC national for awards, but because we made the awards ourselves (an enormous volunteer effort for CPPC), we spent only \$600 on awards, leaving \$600 in the "income" column.

The only area which was not a money maker for the club, was the cost associated with the charter bus tours. Only 60 people took charter bus tours to Mount St. Helens, Mount Hood, Evergreen Aero Plane and Space Museum. In spite of a better rate for the buses, negotiated by Jerry Klinger, we still showed a loss of \$1,596 on the tours. The tours were a big draw for the meet participants from out of the region, but there were fewer of those participants than anticipated. In the interest of good will, the decision was made to keep the tours knowing that we had donations that would help subsidize them.

Donations were the key to the free dinner on Thursday evening of the meet for all the registered meet participants. One hundred thirty free dinners at a cost of \$10.00 each were served to meet participants and along with music provided by Tim McCarthy the dinner was on of the highlights of the week.

The financial success of the meet was due to a combination of ingredients: The hard work of the CPPC members at every turn, donations, good deals and business connections, all contributed to the eventual positive balance in the end.

It is hard to know what type of tours members want to go on, so let us hear your ideas for future events.

The next upcoming club event is the Great Oregon Steam Up July 31st & August 1, in Brooks, Oregon the last weekend of the month. I have never been to this, but I have heard that the parade of steam tractors goes on and on, truly something to see. I think the other venues in Brooks, including the car and truck museums will be open for spectators. Bring a tent and lunch and share the fun of the day.

The First Annual Vancouver Concours d'Elegance, at Fort Vancouver's Officers Row, is August 22. We have purchased a tent space for the club to recuit members and get the word out about the club.
