Help and donations needed for Swap Meet – it's April 13-14!

As you know the club has changed some of the things about how we will function at the Portland Swap Meet this April. Because there are some questions about what is to happen, I thought it important that we review these issues.

First: The club will still accept items donated by members, (or others), that can be sold with proceeds going to the club to help in providing operating funds for the club.

Second: And new for this year, individual members may consign items to the swap meet that can be sold, with the proceeds returned to the seller. The board has set a small fee for these services as follows:

- 1. The club will charge a fee of \$5.00 to each individual who brings items to consign.
- 2. There will be a 20% commission deducted from the proceeds on the first \$100.00 of sales.
- 3. There will be a 10% commission deducted from the proceeds of all sales

above \$100.00.

4. To the degree possible all consigners are expected to sign up for at least one 2 hours shift in manning the booth.

DETAILS OF OPERATION

There will be meeting at Allen Tiffany's shop at 27001 SE 15th Street in Camas, WA at 10:00 am on Saturday the 7th of April for the purpose of sorting and pricing items donated to the club. This would include items left over from previous years. We will load the trailer at that time to bring items onto the grounds.

Those persons wanting to bring consignment items at that time may do so. We only have 4 passes for persons or vehicles to enter the grounds on Thursday April 12th, Vendor Set Up Day. If you need, or want, to use one of those passes please contact Gary at 503-939-9320.

All consignment items - MUST BE IDENTIFIED AS TO CONSIGNER -AND PRICED

We require that all consigned items be boxed and ready for transport and have a firmly attached tag that gives the persons initials for identification purposes, a discription of the item and what it fits (if known), and the asking price for the item.

If this is a fixed price we ask that you put an "F" in the upper right corner of your tag. If you are willing to deal on the price we ask that you circle the price, and in the upper right corner of your tag you can put an "A" if you are willing to take 10% less, a "B" if you are willing to take 20% less, or a "C" if you are willing to take 30% less. We will not discount anything less than the 30% without the consigners agreement.

MAGAZINES AND BOOKS: If you have magazines or books to donate please bring them to the meeting at Allen's on the 7th. We are working on a way to showcase a few of the better items in a way that will maybe provide an increased sales and revenue. Gary will have clear sleeves for magazines and wired tags available on the 7th.

Application forms and CPPC business cards are being printed at the ESD to distribute at the upcoming Swap Meet.


The board also talked about the Portland Swap Meet. (Article on front page.)

These guys are hoping to see some fresh Plymouths at club events this year, and they're willing to help make it so. Talk to them about your project car!


Chevy was the first car he ever drove, he explains, and just sorta stayed with them.

But he had an early Chevy V8 – a 1918 roadster in his shop, in the early stages of restoration, and a '54 Corvette in his showroom, plus a 1937 coupe that looked brand new, that had been a factory demonstrator and was loaded with every option available in 1937.

Ardie also makes models of his cars, and had some bookend-size depictions of his cars as he originally found them.

An entire room of the building is devoted to a library of Chevrolet-specific books, filmstrips, and factory catalogs and manuals, and Chevy posters and memorabilia cover the walls.

Ken did something he claimed he had never done: he abandoned his prepared talk, and strolled through the collection with his visitors, answering questions as they came up. It was a pleasant and informative afternoon with a gracious host.

Ken was a hot-rodder when he was young, and he still builds and sells speed equipment when he can get a break from his real job, manufacturing tools and equipment for dentists. A few of the cars are replicas of things he built as a young man, and each car has its story. Lined up along one wall were a series of early Fords in which Ken can see the evolution of Henry Ford's thinking as he worked towards the Model T. The star of that lineup is the dead-original 1907 Model K roadster.


There were several other Fords, but the eye-popping one for many of us was the yellow roadster with the seriously overcarbureted flathead V-12 in it. This is an extreme "Hot Rod Lincoln," with 12 cylinders instead of 8. Better than the song!
