

Joann Dixon has already received 75 raffle prizes and 4 sponsors for trophies. Please let Joann know if you have something donated.


Technical Committee: Bob Westphal's car is almost ready to run. It needs oil pressure.

Brakes bled but still feel spongy?

Sometimes, Chuck Willis says, your old Plymouth's drum brakes won't feel quite right, even though the hydraulics have been bled correctly.

That might be because the arc of the brake shoes doesn't match the arc of the drum, and the shoes are flexing.

Four separate adjustments – per brake shoe – will fix the problem.

We're hoping for a how-to article about this common situation, but Chuck says he would much rather do the job for members, than explain how to do it for an article.

There's a special tool for the job, and Chuch has it. Give him a call if your Plymouth's brakes need attention.
