

Robin Will moved to amend the bylaws 4.2 to include all the cars in the roster. The membership voted unanimously to change the bilaws to include all cars.


Modified Cars: Bobbi Berkheimer, the National Vice President, and the other officers are still discussing to include Modified Class to the National judging.

## Authentic license plates can enhance a restoration project

Many states, as a cost saving policy, didn't issue license plates in various years. These states instead issued a license sticker that was placed inside the car in the lower right corner of the windshield in lew of the plate. Consequently, many car collectors don't have the same year vintage license plate, as the year of their car, displayed on their car. They are using a plate either one year earlier or later than the year of their car, such as a 1929 Oregon plate on a 1930 car. When people look at your car they automatically assume that the year of the plate dictates the year of the car. To clarify the year of their car, some people are using an altered vintage plate which has had the year changed to match the year of their car. This stops the confusion as to year identity but it isn't original to the year of the era and actual correctness for purists. Law enforcement people such as the Highway Patrols have access to the variations of skipped plate years in their various states. So far most police don't say anything about these discrepancies and are more interested in ogling your car. However, a hard nosed and knowledgeable cop just might, if for some reason he didn't like the color of your eyes, give you a hassle. Original miss-

ing year stickers are rarer than hen's teeth and would cost an arm and the proverbial leg, if one could be found. Some not so correct missing year stickers, that were applied on the outside of the windshield, have shown up at swap meets for unreasonable prices in the past. That is all in the past now because Robert Hoyt's Classic Windshield Stickers at http://inspectionsticker. net/ can provide exact replicas of these stickers, for every state in these United States. The cost is a very reasonable fifteen dollars plus shipping. Many states printed the previous year license number on the original sticker at the time of issue. In the event your state did, Bob Hoyt's will place the license number of your vintage plate on the repo sticker for a ten dollar extra cost. Hoyts also



carries inspection, ration, and various other vintage stickers. I have one of Hoyts license stickers on my P-15 and am impressed with the accuracy of their reproduction. Note: I, in no way profit from this information and pass it on to others so they can have a correct licensing procedure for the year of their car.




