



Low-tech strategy removes rusted nuts

Bob Westphal recently shared a video about a "new" way to remove rusted lug nuts.

Or maybe it's an old way. If you ever wondered how people got stuff done back in the day before power tools, this video might be a clue.

It's really low-tech. It requires a cigarette lighter and a candle.

Hold the lighter immediately below the lug nut in question. Heat up the lug nut a little bit. Hold the candle immediately above the nut, so melting wax will drip down over it. Give it about two minutes, then take the heat away.

The heat expands everything, and the candle wax is drawn in as a lubricant. The nut will loosen to the point that it's wrenchable.


