


Gary Rusher led the Car Quiz:

Vacuum windshield wiper motors benefit from regular maintenance


Editor's Note: I found this on one of the car sites online, and stole it for CPPC. The original documents are JPEGS, apparently scans of a manual intended for owners of Model A Fords. However, I suspect vacuum wiper setups are similar enough to make this worthwhile. I can furnish the originial JPGS to anyone who would like to print their own copy. The relevant portion of the text is reproduced below.

Aside from the benefits of working windshield wipers, believe it or not, the performance of the engine is affected as leakage in the wiper motor lowers the intake manifold vacuum and leans out the fuel-air mixture.

(This article recommends using brake fluid as a lubricant, but considering the damage to paint that brake fluid can cause, experts suggest using a light machine oil.)

- Remove the vacuum hose at the wiper motor. Lightly hold your finger over the hose nipple on the motor and cycle the wiper blade back and forth. Note that in one direction the motor sucks in air, and in the opposite direction, the motor expels air through the nipple. Place the wiper blade in the position such that the motor will begin to suck air at the nipple.
- 2. Attach a six-inch long piece of hose to the motor nipple and hold the open end up. Using a squeeze bottle, force one teaspoonful of lubricant into the hose. Place a rag on the cowl below the wiper motor. Hold another rag over the open end of the hose.
- 3. Cycle the wiper blade back and forth several times. Repeat the process again, adding a second teaspoonful of lubricant.
- 4. Start the engine and run the wiper motor. It should run well. If it does not, the wiper motor should be disassembled, cleaned, inspected and a rebuilding kit installed. It is normal for the wiper to slow down when the car is accelerated, but it should not stop altogether.

This particular diagram illustrates the vacuum wiper motor from a Model A Ford, but it is probably similar enough to use as reference. CPPC members who would like their own copy should drop and email to Robin for the original JPG file to print at home.


Member Care: Joanne reported on on Patty Brost's status. She is at home and appreciates all the phone calls and cards she has received.

The meeting was adjourned at 2:37 PM.




