

Cruise-In on August 11th, our 13th since 2005. This success happens through many heroic efforts of key members of our



This month's Technical article delves into a subject I am personally involved in at present. I am replacing all of the incandescent bulbs with modern LED versions. I will share with you what I have learned to date. The detail of this subject necessitates that a brief version appear in the newsletter, with the *full* article and illustrations on the CPPC Website.

6 Volt Positive Ground. The focus of this article is upon <u>6 volt positive</u> ground systems - and upon vehicles from the mid 1930s up into the 1950s.

My research showed that there are

really only two bulb base sizes used in most of the Mopar vehicles over these years. Those sizes still exist - and are a Ba15 and a Ba9 base. Ba stands for bayonet, and the 9 and 15 are the sizes. Each of these sizes has multiple configurations with numerical bulb designations.

LEDs are "light emitting diodes" they glow when energized, but unlike conventional bulbs, they do not have filaments. One should not expect an LED bulb to shine exactly the same as a traditional filament auto bulb, but they work very well.

Polarity. As a single diode, an LED is sensitive to the leads being correctly

connected to a DC circuit. Fortunately, in the automotive LED applications I have reviewed, almost all of these new bulbs will work on either positive or negative circuits - and many will work on both 6 volt and 12 volt setups!

Phil and Rose Ann go to Grand Nationals – with lots of side trips

Rose Ann and I had a great time driving to the Grand National Meet in Northville, Michigan in our 1954 Plymouth Belvedere (HyDrive). On our way to the meet we toured the Great Lakes around Wisconsin and Michigan, toured the Northern Peninsula of Michigan, and we rode the magnificent old ferry, the SS Badger on a four hour ferry ride across Lake Michigan. On the way home, we took the modern and much faster Lake Express ferry across Lake Michigan. We also detoured to Reno, Nevada on our return trip to visit some old family friends. Total round trip was 6,632 miles; 15 states; 24 days. We saw a lot of magnificent country and met many truly wonderful people.

On two different occasions we decided to drive all night in order to avoid 100 degree weather in Utah, Nevada and California. In these instances, we would wait for the sun to go down before proceeding on our trip. On the all night run between Reno and Roseburg, we took a roundabout route to avoid the heavy smoke from forest fires. The route consisted of very lonely roads east of the Sierra Nevada Mountains, then eastern Oregon, finally crossing the Cascade Mountains north of Crater Lake, and down the North Umpgua Highway to Roseburg. We carried and used a 2 1/2 gallon gas can since the remote little towns we were passing through did not have gas stations that stayed open after midnight.

We experienced a number of rain storms on our trip, the fiercest of which was in Michigan. Then there was that sand storm in northern Nevada. In addition to the sand, tumbleweeds were flying across the road, several of which hit our car.

The biggest challenge to our Plymouth was the many long and steep (continued on page 7)

Mayflowers enjoy tour of The Grotto on July 18



Cost is reasonable for these bulbs and quite comparable to obsolete 6 volt auto bulbs. To convert the bulbs in my car - including fog and backup lights, cost about \$110. That included a special LED flasher.

Sizes of LED bulbs compare closely to that of incandescent bulbs, and more sizes are under development. They <u>look</u> different, because there is no glass "bulb" around them. The CPPC website has a size comparison image.

Special Considerations Older vehicles will typically have sockets the bulb base sizes mentioned will work in. They may, however, have different wiring schemes both as OEM and modified systems. Turn signals typically were not on older vehicles, and the bulb types reflect this. You will have to carefully examine each of your sockets to see what might be required.

Sourcing Six volt automotive bulbs are no longer a common, high volume item for manufacturing. That is even more of an issue when considering LED replacements. I located one particular company that has LED replacements for all of the bulbs I needed. They can be found on the Internet at LEDLight.com.

I have not yet done the installation of all the LED bulbs that I purchased. As I accomplish this, I will make note of any new insight or issues both in the CPPC newsletters as well as on the CPPC website.
