Vice-President Jake Higginbotham called the meeting to order at 6:55PM and led the membership in the flag salute.

Jake and the membership thanked John Cooper for providing refreshments.

Minutes of the February 28 meeting were approved as published in the newsletter.

Treasurer Dolores Call's financial report was approved as submitted.

Jake asked members to be thinking about ideas for speakers for future club meetings.

Swap Meet coordinator Robin Will announced that he had cancelled his year's club participation in Portland Swap Meet and applied for a refund of space rent paid in advance last year. Not enough people were available to fill the work schedule and handle load-in and load-out.

John Cooper announced that the next cruise-in meeting would be Monday, May 8 at 10:00AM in Clackamette Park.

Mindy Benfield reviewed the Mayflowers' tour of Mt. Angel, and revealed the next Mayflower tour would go to the Hoover-Minthorn House in Newberg on April 28, with details to be announced.

Jake Higginbotham reported on the Portland Roadster Show. He was impressed with the organization and the caliber of the cars, and said his own 1949 Plymouth business couple missed out on a trophy to a car that had an upholstered trunk.


Joanne Dixon reported that Rob Peterson had signaled his availability as DJ for the cruise-in.

In a sensible world, Plymouth might have used the same hood hinges they put on the '37 passenger car –but no.

I circulated his request to a couple of CPPC members and put a WANTED ad on our website, to no avail, but Zak stayed in touch, sending pictures of his project as it progressed, and sharing his search for the only bits he couldn't locate – the hood hinges.

On April 3, Zak wrote, "After fighting with 85 yr old worn hood and hinge parts with no replacements available for over a month, called a Texas Hot Rod shop. Anyway, they sent out sample pieces of the 1932 Ford hinge material and brackets that maybe be used on 1930's Plymouth's/ Dodges. Yahoo, finished the hood install yesterday and only thing left is the head lights."

I'm sharing Zak's pictures of the project. I'm requesting pics of the finished car, and I'll be inviting him to a CPPC meeting when he can make it up this way.




