With the details mostly out of the way, CPPC members can do the other thing they do best – step up and smile, represent the club, and make guests feel welcome.




Date and time: Sunday, June 11, Downbeat at 3:00 p.m.

Mike made an offer, and we are now in the Parts Business a little longer.

Randy and Mike have inventoried and photographed all the parts and getting prices, so they can put on the internet.

Mike has already begun to sell things, through Facebook and eBay and by the time this goes in the newsletter, the amount paid to buy the parts, will already paid back.


