## Minutes of the January, 2024 membership meeting

Cascade Pacific Plymouth Club met on January 23, 2024, at the Clackamas Community Club, 15711 SE 90th Ave., Clackamas, OR. Nineteen people were in attendance. Robin Will took the minutes.

Almost without fail, members commented on the traffic that had slowed them down on the way.

President Mike Bade called the meeting to order at 6:45PM.

Mike thanked John Cooper for providing snacks for the meeting.

Jake Higginbotham led the flag salute.

Minutes of the October 24, 2023, membership meeting were approved as printed in the newsletter.

Following a motion from the floor, the slate of CPPC officers for 2024-2026 were elected by acclaim. Mike Bade is president; Jake Higginbotham remains as vice-president; Dolores Call remains as treasurer; and Joanne Dixon remains as Member-at-Large. Jim Wheat becomes Chairman of the Board. Motion was seconded and passed by voice vote with no one opposed.

Mike Bade reviewed Treasurer Dolores Call's financial report. The club doesn't publish our bank balance, but we remain in solid financial condition.

Jake Higginbotham introduced the guest speaker for the evening, Tom Kargman, an auto appraiser who is affiliated with the Auto Appraisal Network and who has been working with them since 2007. Tom described the sort of appraisals he can provide, including the appraisals like the one he did for Jake's 1949 Plymouth business coupe hot rod, and also the sadder "value before loss" appraisals that end up in court when insurance companies fight it out after the damage occurs. He made a good case for spending a little less than the cost of detailing a car every couple of years to protect an investment in case of accident.

Second "guest speaker" was Jake Higginbotham, who read aloud from a booklet entitled What is a Hershberger? about his maternal grandfather, Jacob Hershberger, who had the first auto dealership in Hubbard when there were only three cars in town. The Hershberger family operated auto dealerships in the mid-Willamette Valley for most of the 20th Century.

John Cooper gave an update on cruise-in planning, reporting on some streamlining to make the event run more smoothly and mentioning that we will have help from Clackamas Community College students this year, either from one of the athletic teams or from students in the Auto Technology department.

Robin Will reported on very early Swap Meet organizing and gave his usual updates on the newsletter and CPPC's website. Swap Meet load-in will be set for late-afternoon on Thursday in hope that people with jobs might be able to assist. He will create sign-up sheets online as well as circulate them at meetings. Since we're downsizing to three booths, Robin hopes to loadin without taking the club trailer, but that's not settled. We'll definitely have the entire Ealy inventory printed out to help people looking for specific items, and Robin/Tech Commmittee/Mike Bade have yet to agree on what will be offered for sale in the limited space.

Mindy Benfield announced the Mayflower meeting to plan 2024 activities, February 16 at Elmer's Restaurant in Clackamas,

Joanne Dixon, Member at Large, asked about updated membership packets.

There was general discussion about the tour of the WAAAM museum in Hood River, scheduled for February 10.

Mike Bade said he didn't want to sound whiny, but things would go more smoothly is someone from the membership stepped up to serve as Activities Coordinator. Robin promised that the whine would go in the official minutes of the meeting.

Door prizes were won by Mike Bade, Jerry Klinger, Dave Surmon, and Donna Bade.

My wife and I are new members to the Cascade Pacific Plymouth Club. We joined after buying a 1937 Plymouth P4 coupe.

We found the coupe in Lynden, Washington, in a fella's estate collection of vintage Chrysler product cars. We decided on the '37 coupe.

We got it home in mid-Oct. Lots of fun towing it thru Seattle and Portland, since we lucked out by timing going thru both cities during rush hour. We live on the Coast just below Winchester Bay, and did it in one, LONG day!

The coupe had been parked since the early 60's, so it needed quite alot of help. We already knew the trunk lid and body panel under it had serious rust.

I started advertising for a good, us-

able trunk lid on all the Vintage Plymouth/Dodge facebook forums. After almost getting scammed twice, it became obvious there wasn't any trunk lids out there to be had, or at least no one contacted me with one. I would need to either hire it out for repair or do the repairs myself. I have done body work before, so I decided to tackle the job it myself.

So, some welding rod, sheet steel, metal adhesive and some fiberglass cloth and resin and I began.

It came out pretty good. Just took alot of time measuring and fitting the new metal to get it where it needed to be to fit right.

Perfect repair ? Probably not. But it fits good and closes good. I am happy with the outcome, and i saved lots of money. Money that , I'm sure, will be needed down the road.

Now on to brakes, brake lines and cylinders. who knows, it may be road-worthy in this century !!??

The Board of Directors of Cascade Pacific Plymouth Club met on February 13, 2024, at Elmer's Restaurant in Clackamas, Oregon. Present were Mike Bade, Dolores Call, Jim Wheat, Joanne Dixon, and Robin Will. Robin will took the minutes.

Board chairman Jim Wheat called the meeting to order at 11:39AM.

Minutes of the January 9, 2024, board meeting were approved as published in the newsletter.

Treasurer Dolores Call's financial report was approved as submitted. CPPC does not publish our bank balance, but any board member can answer questions.

At the time of the meeting, 40-50 members had not paid their 2024 CPPC dues. There was general discussion about which steps to take to remind members to pay. Deadline will be sometime in March or early April, since the 2014 roster will be available at the April membership meeting.

Mike Bade noted that in the "expenses vs. income" report, that the club is currently showing a deficit in operations. Car Show and Swap Meet income have made up that deficit in the past, but with future Swap Meet revenue in jeopardy, we need to discuss ways to bring in money.

Mike reported \$521.66 in club proceeds for eBay sales for January-February so far and gave Dolores a check.

Robin Will brought a proposed layout for CPPC's three-booth Swap Meet presence, and there was general discussion. It's not yet clear if we'll need to bring the entire club trailer to load-in, or whether it's possible to select the items we need from the trailer and use members' vehicles for load-in. It's also not clear yet which merchandise we'll be selling, and how it will be chosen from our overall inventory. It's going to be necessary to have an entire print-out of the inventory in the booth for people looking for specific items. Robin will secure a print file from Randy and Pam Ealy. Robin will have a schedule and sign-up sheet online before the next club meeting.

Member-at-Large: Joanne Dixon responded to national POC president Russ Nardi's request for materials for a Plymouth-related display at the AACA Museum in Hershey, PA. Joanne has memorabilia including materials from the club's 2006 tour to Mt. St. Helens, and flyers from the club's 10th anniversary picnic in 2010. That prompted reminiscences from Mike and Robin, who have print files for previous CPPC car shows and other events. They'll be taking another look at materials suitable for submission to the AACA exhibit.

Cruise-In Planning: the next committee meeting is schedule for March 26 immediately before the membership meeting. The insurance rider is paid. Mike has the tee-shirt design finalized. The business license waiver is finalized.


