In spite of the rain, we still had a successful show and happy participants. Over the years we hear how much folks appreciate all the work they know goes into putting on our show and they enjoy having it at the park.

Yes, the rain kept cars away. Sixteen

of the preregistered fifty eight cars decided to pass due to the weather. Twenty eight cars registered on Saturday. That gave us a grand total of seventy cars at our show.

The main awards are as follows: Brad Groff won the Host Car with a 58 Plymouth Belvedere convertible; Peoples Choice went to Kevin Ernst for a 68 Ford 4X4; Long Distance went to Fred Braun from LaPine, OR with a 67 Camaro convertible; The Mayflower award went to Virginia Hernandez for a 67 Chevelle SS 396; The Best of Show was won by Michael Hinsch for a 65 Ford Thunderbird. There were also the 24 Judges Choice Awards, presented.

We also presented checks for \$2000 to the CCC Automotive Department, Scholarship Fund. The CCC Track Team was very helpful and received a \$500 check.

Even though we were low on the number of cars, compared to last year, the Silent Auction brought in \$300 more than last year, totaling well over \$800. Also the new design on the Tee

shirts sold very well, 78 sold even with our small turnout.

After awarding scholarship money to the Automotive Department and Track Team, figuring expenses (DJ, Park rental, etc.), looks like the Club treasury will receive \$1800. If the weather had been better we may have brought in an additional \$3000.

**Minutes of the May 2024 membership meeting**

Members of Cascade Pacific Plymouth Club met on March 28, 2024 at the Clackamas Community Club, 15711 SE 90th Ave., Clackamas, OR. Twenty-six members were present.

President Mike Bade called the meeting to order at 6:35PM.

After the flag salute, Mike thanked Linda and Dave Surmon for bringing refreshments. Stephanie Willis will bring refreshments next month.

Mike reviewed June birthdays, and thanked Robin Will for taking the meeting minutes.

Minutes of the April 23 meeting were approved as published in the newsletter.

The month's financial report reveals lots of activity related to the upcoming cruise-in, and the club remains in solid financial condition. Any board member can answer questions.

Mike Bade summarized eBay sales: things have slowed down as spring picks up, and his last check to the club was for \$74.

Cruise-In committee: John Cooper is requesting that members arrive at 6:00-6:30AM to set up, asked members to bring pop-up canopies, and reminded everybody to bring their own chairs.

Donna Bade reported on Joanne Dixon's current situation (recovering from a fall, bossing the raffle/silent auction process from her bed in the care center). Cynthia and D.J. Freeman will stand in for Joanne to supervise the silent auction at the cruise-in. So far \$1700 has been raised that will go directly to the scholarship fund; the award sponsorship positions have been filled; and donations are still coming in for scholarships, raffles, and goodie bag items.

Randy Ealy provided a Cruise-In budget update: park rent went from \$922 to \$1625, with a \$500 returnable damage deposit. Tee-shirt expense went from \$900 to \$1714. However, by changing the style of the trophies for the event, we saved \$400.

There was general financial discussion: how much to give to the scholarship fund, how much to give to the track team for help parking cars, with-

out conclusions.

Randy said the Tech Committee is still getting calls from a gentleman in Hawaii who is chasing parts for a 1934 Plymouth, and he was pleased to report that somebody purchased all five big boxes of shop manuals for a total of \$125.

Mindy Benfield reminded members of the upcoming Mayflower tour to the Withycombe Military Museum in Clackamas on May 31.

Mike Bade's presentation was on dash pads, and the process involved in getting chrome onto plastic for bezels, escutcheons, etc. that need refreshing as part of a restoration process.

Activities: Ealys are hosting the July 13 visit to Donald Daze. Information is in newsletter and on website.

August 10 is the date chosen for CPPC's annual picnic at Clackamas Memory Care. Jim Wheat will provide info, maps, etc.

Cruise-In tee shirts are ready for members who pre-paid.

Door prizes were won by Bob Derbyshire, Jeanna Pemberton, and Judie Byrnes.

Phil Hall won the 50/50 jackpot.

The meeting was adjourned at 8:10PM.

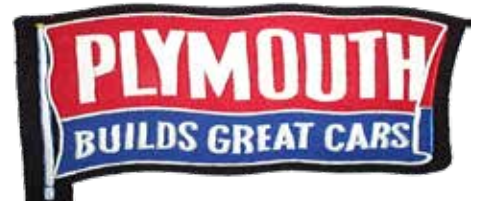

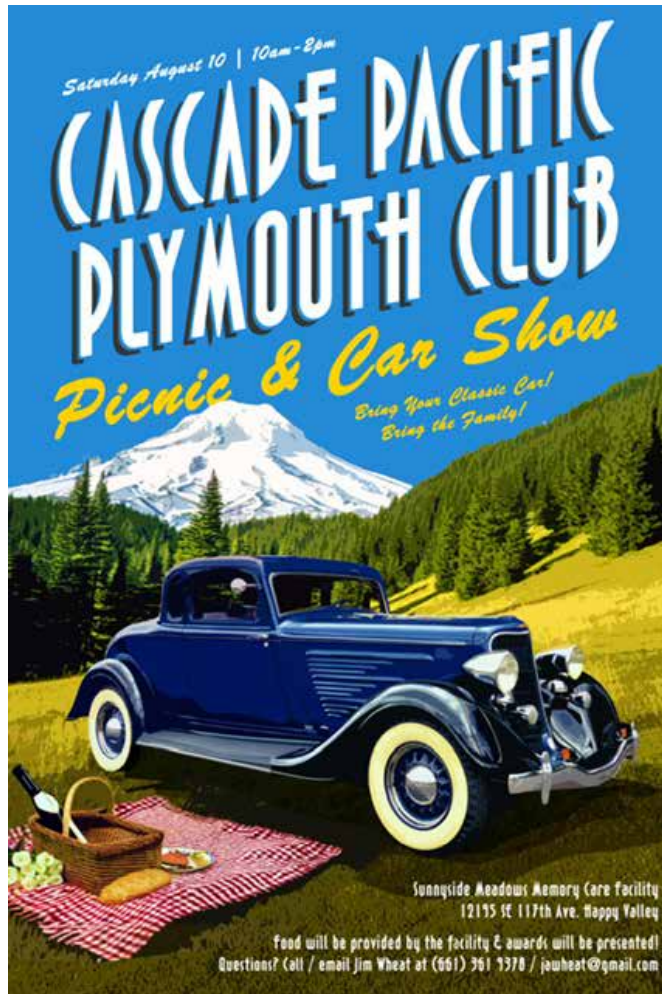
